When others judge us wrongly:

Take a close look at this Sunday's Gospel story. Jesus has just finished reading the scripture that we heard on the previous Sunday ("The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor," etc.). He tells the people in the synagogue that this scripture is now being fulfilled through him, and they all speak highly of him. But by the end of this scripture, they're furious with him.

What changed their attitude? Their awe turned into confusion when they remembered, "Isn't this the son of Joseph?" Unlike those who would meet Jesus for the first time in later chapters of the story, these people had experiences with Jesus the toddler who fell when learning to walk, Jesus the teenager who bled from mistakes made while learning the carpentry trade from his father, Jesus the young man who wept at his father's funeral.

Their attitude changed when they stopped listening with their spirits and started listening with their pre-conceived notions. This disconnect from the divine then stirred up their emotions.

Think of how people react when you confuse them by doing or saying something out of character, that is, out of the character that they expect from you. If you're perceived as too young or too old to do what you are in fact capable of doing, or if your education level doesn't include a formal degree that proves that you know what you do already know, or if you don't tell people what they want to hear, their surprise turns into confusion that triggers an emotional response against you.

We expect them to believe us and trust us, and when they don't, our surprise turns into confusion that triggers an emotional response against them. But how did Jesus handle it when they treated him this way? He calmly spoke a truth that was inspired by the Holy Spirit. Did he have an emotional reaction? Sure! He was human like us; we were all created by the Father to have emotions. The problem is not in the emotions; the problem occurs when we listen through our emotions instead of our spiritual connection to the Holy Spirit.

Community Hot Meal Information

As some folks may not be aware of what the Community Hot Meal is all about here is some information: Our church has joined with 6 other churches in Weyburn to prepare and package meals for those less fortunate in our community. Some of the churches lack manpower to prepare the meals so they assist in packaging the meals. Our church takes its turn once per month on the second Sunday. We have two more turns, Feb. 13th and Mar. 13th. Approximately 85 meals are delivered each time. I put out the call in the bulletin for pots of soup to be made as well as buns and cookies. Generous volunteers in our church supply me with the needed food. The food is delivered to Knox Hall on the designated Sunday afternoon by 4:30pm. Once all the food has arrived the soup is dished out into 24 oz Styrofoam containers. Jane and John Smith provide the names and amount of meals needed per order and our workers place soup, buns and cookies in the brown paper bag. A label is attached with the name of the client and drivers deliver the meals around town. The delivery time is between 5 - 5:30 pm. The process is very smooth and in no time the meals are all packaged and delivered while still hot. If you know of someone who could benefit from a meal please contact John Smith at 306-891-4123. He will make contact.

Here is what is required for our next session on Feb. 13th (thank you to the volunteers who have already stepped forward with pots of soup and buns): 5 pots of soup, 3 dozen buns (2 per Ziploc bag), 12 dozen cookies (2 per Ziploc bag). <u>"Bible Corner" - Revelation V – Two</u> <u>Modes of Transmission</u>

Most Catholics would know that God's Revelation has two modes of **transmission**: Scripture & Tradition (CCC#82). However, there was a subtle change in emphasis at Vatican II to one source, "Jesus Christ" (CCC#80); we will have more on this later. Defining the two modes, we have (CCC#81): "Sacred Scripture is the speech of God as it is put down in writing under the breath of the Holy Spirit." "Tradition transmits in its entirety the Word of God which has been entrusted to the apostles by Christ the Lord and the Holy Spirit." "Tradition" is not to be confused with small "t" theological, disciplinary, liturgical, or devotional "tradition" (CCC#83), which may be changed; capital "T" Tradition does not change. Next week we will have a word on the Role of the Magisterium in the two modes of transmission.
